We have been gifted a beautiful bird bath by the late Whaea Penny, this will be our first water station for our bees.

We have fundraising initiatives on the go from next week on. These funds will be going towards our Year 8s leaver's taonga. \$1 iceblocks and \$2 juicies will be available at lunchtimes.

Next Friday we will be taking part in Gumboot Friday. Our tamariki are encouraged to bling their gumboots out on the day and bring a koha for the official Gumboot Friday kaupapa. The iceblocks and juicies sold on the day will go towards our contribution as a kura.
