

Te Awatea have been learning about honey bees (ngā pī honi).


We visited the bee hives on our field and talked about how bees collect pollen and make honey.

Some tamariki were keen to try on a bee suit and they discovered that the suits made us feel very hot but kept us safe.


Whaea Lyn read the story "Brown Bread & Honey" so we made honey sandwiches for afternoon tea-


Te Haeata tamariki loved working with their tuākana as well as all the interesting equipment such as mussel buoys, ropes, and tarpaulins.

We also have had our Kansai students with us for the last three weeks. We have enjoyed learning alongside you and wish you all the best!










Ngā Mataamua ō te Kura - Te Amorangi












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
