Pito Hauora is a preventative and wellbeing hub for everyone in the rohe providing access to health screening, immunisations and other intervention services closer to home.



This Kaupapa is a partnership between Te Whatu Ora and Te Korowai Hauora o Hauraki under the umbrella of Te Tara o Te Whai (Localities). Pito Hauora aims to deliver these services in a way that is uniquely Māori yet inclusive of all peoples who choose to engage with their services.

The hub is intended to grow and continue expanding services. Pito Hauora symbolises the potential growth and refers to the promise of a healthier pathway for whānau.
